Course Outline

Class Description

This class will continue to look at key aspects of what it truly means to follow God. There will be a focus on the fear of God, faith, and having an eternal perspective. Students will be encouraged and challenged as they study the commands of Christ, and hopefully spurred to a complete surrender to Jesus Christ.

Objectives

1. That each student would understand the fear of God and be encouraged towards holy living.
2. That each student would understand how God increases our faith.
3. That each student would develop an eternal perspective before God.

Class Requirements

2. Daily Homework - Each student needs to complete the daily homework assigned.

Day	Homework
Day #1	Read all the verses given in the outline "The Fear of God" Spend time prayer asking God to make these truths a reality in your life. Memorize Proverbs 8:13
Day #2	Read all the verses given in the outline "Faith and Trust" Spend time prayer asking God to make these truths a reality in your life. Memorize Hebrews 11:6
Day #3	Read Acts 20 Read John 4 Read Matthew 4:17-22 Memorize Acts 20:24
Day #4	Read Mark 4:1-20 Read Hebrews 3 and 4 Memorize Matthew 9:37
Day 5	Finish Final Project
Final Project	Write a 3-5 page paper on the fear of God. What is the biblical meaning of the fear of God? How does that change my perspective on life? How does it encourage me to live daily?
