Holy Bible

“True Discipleship” By W. MacDonald

Class Description

A verse by verse study of the gospel of John that will allow students to see the main themes of the book of the message that God wanted to communicate to the world.

Objectives

1. To gain a clear understanding of the gospel of John.
2. To gain an understanding of Jesus as the manifestation of God.
3. To know that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and have life in His name.
4. To understand the work of the Holy Spirit.
5. Gain an apologetic understanding of the crucifixion events.

Class Requirements

1. Attendance - Each student needs to watch all video classes and participate in all video meetings.
2. Daily Homework - Each student will need to outline the chapters to be covered in the upcoming class. Also complete any homework designated by the teacher.
3. Bible - Each student will be required to read the gosepl of John in its entirety 3 times outside of class.
4. Final Project - Two 3-5 page papers:
 1. What it means to “take in Christ” per John 6 and others parts of the book. Students will need to explain what that means in terms of salvation, and how it is different from what they have heard from the modern church.
 2. Explain why the commandment in John 13:34 is a new commandment, and how the command is to be obeyed and applied in everyday life. Please include personal application.

5. Read: "True Discipleship" by William MacDonald. Students will write a 2-4 page paper on what aspect of the book most impacted them. Please include personal application... what are you going to do now?
